PER CURIAM:<sup>1</sup>

After holding a bench trial in this Title VII racial discrimination case, the district court rendered a thorough opinion reviewing the evidence and concluding that the defendants' nondiscriminatory reasons for failing to properly score or promote Reves Black, Jr. were not pretextual. Our review of the record shows that this finding is well supported and not clearly erroneous. See E.E.O.C. v. Louisiana Office of Community

Services, 47 F.3d 1438, 1443-48 (5th Cir. 1995) (genuine but unsupported belief of discrimination does not satisfy plaintiff's burden to prove pretext).

The district court's judgment is therefore AFFIRMED.
