Jack Andrews appeals the district court's decision in favor of the Commissioner which denied Social Security disability benefits and supplemental security income to Andrews. Andrews contends that the Administrative Law Judge erred in finding that he did not meet the listing for Meniere's disease and in assessing his complaints of vertigo. Andrews also contends that the Administrative Law Judge erred by failing to assess the

credibility of Andrew's nonexertional impairments. Andrews asserts that the Administrative Law Judge erred by discounting the opinion of his treating physician.

We have reviewed the record and the briefs of the parties and find no error in the decision of the district court.

Accordingly, we affirm for essentially the same reasons advanced by the district court.

Andrews also moved this court to order a remand to the Commissioner for consideration of additional medical evidence. The motion is DENIED.
