Tommy Lee Jackson appeals the magistrate judge's dismissal of his civil rights suit as frivolous under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(d). We have reviewed the record, the magistrate judge's statement of reasons, and Jackson's brief; and we find no reversible error. (November 9, 1995). Because of the disposition of Jackson's appeal, his motions for preparation of a transcript at government expense and for the court to "intervene and stop continuous deliberate indifference" are DENIED.

Jackson is reminded that he has been cautioned not to file frivolous appeals. Any further frivolous filings by him will result in the forfeiting of his right to file any pro se and in forma pauperis suits without the permission of a judge.
