PER CURIAM:*

Amanda Johnson Meshaw appeals her convictions for wire fraud and resultant sentence. She argues that the evidence was insufficient to support her convictions and that at sentencing the district court erred in its calculation of the amount of the loss attributable to her.

We have reviewed the record and find sufficient evidence to

support the convictions.¹ Also, the district court did not err in sentencing Meshaw based on evidence from acquitted counts.² Accordingly, the judgment of the district court is AFFIRMED.
