Raymond Harris, # 85555, appeals the dismissal of his 42 U.S.C. § 1983 civil rights complaint. Harris argues that the district court erred in dismissing his § 1983 action pursuant to Sandin v. Conner, 115 S. Ct. 2293 (1995). We have reviewed the record and found no error in the reasoning of the district court. See Harris v. Barr, No. 96-CV-359 (M.D. La. Jun. 6, 1996).

Harris' appeal is without arguable merit and, thus, frivolous.

See Howard v. King, 707 F.2d 215, 219-20 (5th Cir. 1983).

Because the appeal is frivolous, it is DISMISSED. See 5th Cir.

filed by him or on his behalf will invite the imposition of

sanctions. Harris is cautioned further to review any pending

appeals to ensure that they do not raise arguments that are
