Asemendes Williams, prisoner #659605, appeals the district court's denial of his motion for a preliminary injunction and/or a temporary restraining order. The denial of an application for a temporary restraining order is not appealable. Matter of Lieb, 915 F.2d 180, 183 (5th Cir. 1990). Williams has not shown a

likelihood of success on the merits and irreparable injury warranting a preliminary injunction, and the district court did not abuse its discretion in denying his motion. Lakedreams v. Taylor, 932 F.2d 1103, 1106-07 (5th Cir. 1991). The decision of the district court is AFFIRMED.
