Louisiana, No. 97-30415 (5th Cir. Sept. 4, 1997). The district court having determined that no extension of time was warranted, the case is DISMISSED for lack of jurisdiction. See Fed. R. App. P. 4(a). Spooner's CPC motion is DENIED.
