Celestino-Garcia argues that his sentence was improperly enhanced pursuant to Title 8 U.S.C. § 1326(b) based upon his prior commission of an aggravated felony, because the charging indictment did not mention the aggravated felony. His argument is foreclosed by <u>United States v. Vasquez-Olvera</u>, 999 F.2d 943 (5th Cir. 1993).
