Enrique Moreno pleaded guilty to count two of an indictment charging him with conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute marijuana. Moreno has raised one issue on appeal—whether the district court erred in failing to depart to the extent requested by the Government in its motion for a downward departure. The argument raised by Moreno was rejected by the court in <u>United</u>

States v. Alvarez, 51 F.3d 36, 38-41 (5th Cir. 1995). Because the appeal is frivolous, it is DISMISSED. <u>See Howard v. King</u>,

707 F.2d 215, 219-20 (5th Cir. 1983); 5TH CIR. R. 42.2.
