Joe Sam Jones, prisoner # 514721, appeals the dismissal of his civil rights action as frivolous pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B)(i). Jones' motion to file reply brief out of time is GRANTED. Because Jones' case contained no arguable basis in law or fact, it is frivolous, and the district court did not err in dismissing it. <u>Allison v. Kyle</u>, 66 F.2d 71, 73 (5th Cir. 1995). <u>See Siglar v. Hightower</u>, 112 F.3d 191, 193 (5th Cir.

1997). Jones' motion for appointment of counsel to conduct oral argument is DENIED.

Jones' appeal is without arguable merit and therefore frivolous. <u>See Howard v. King</u>, 707 F.2d 215, 219-20 (5th Cir. 1983). Because the appeal is frivolous, it is dismissed. <u>See</u> 5th Cir. R. 42.2.
