He argues that the district court erred by not granting his request for a "downward departure" based on minor participation and that the sentencing enhancements he received constitute double counting and violates the Double Jeopardy Clause. In his plea agreement, Tremblay waived his right to appeal on these grounds. See United States v. Portillo, 18 F.3d 290, 292-93 (5th Cir. 1994).
