PER CURIAM:*

Manuel Ortiz, Louisiana state prisoner # 349580, appeals from the district court's grant of summary judgment to the defendants in his Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) suit. 5 U.S.C. § 552. Ortiz argues that certain information should not have been withheld from him, maintaining that any individual privacy interests in keeping the withheld information confidential were outweighed by the public interest in its release, and that the FBI failed to provide him with all non-

exempt materials covered by his FOIA request. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Ortiz has failed to advance any particular *public* interests that may be served by disclosure of the withheld information. See Burge v. Eastburn, 934 F.2d 577, 579 (5th Cir. 1991). Further, his contention that the FBI failed to provide him with over 700 additional pages of documents relates to a separate FOIA request that is not the subject of this litigation. Accordingly, the judgment of the district court is AFFIRMED.
