Pedro Valle-Gonzalez appeals his conviction of unlawfully attempting to reenter the United States after having been deported, in violation of 8 U.S.C. § 1326. He argues only that the indictment was insufficient because it failed to allege that he specifically intended to enter the United States unlawfully. As Valle-Gonzalez acknowledges, this argument is forestalled by this court's holding in <u>United States v. Trevino-Martinez</u>, 86 F.3d 65, 69 (5th Cir. 1996). Accordingly, his conviction is AFFIRMED.
