PER CURIAM:*

Appealing the judgment in a criminal case, Jose Luis Nunez-Luna presents arguments that he concedes are foreclosed by *United States v. Gomez-Herrera*, 523 F.3d 554, 562-63 (5th Cir. 2008), which held that the disparity between sentences of defendants who can participate in a fast-track program and defendants who cannot is not “unwarranted” within the meaning of 18 U.S.C. § 3553(a)(6).
