PER CURIAM:*

The Federal Public Defender appointed to represent Jesus Vega-Olvera has moved for leave to withdraw and has filed a brief as required by Anders v. California, 386 U.S. 738 (1967). Vega-Olvera has not filed a timely response. Vega-Olvera has moved for an extension of time in which to file his response. He asserts that he seeks to challenge the district court's finding that he had been convicted of an aggravated felony. We have considered that point and additional pleadings are not needed. Vega-Olvera's motion for an extension is DENIED as unnecessary.
