APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE ELECTRONIC PUBLIC
ACCESS FEES BY HENRY ROACH

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Henry Roach for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds that Henry Roach, a law student at Stanford University, is researching his thesis that police officers sometimes treat Buie sweeps (Maryland v. Buie) as a matter of course without having articulable suspicion. Specifically, Roach is reviewing suppression hearing transcripts. Additionally, Roach has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information. Accordingly, Roach shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of researching his thesis. Roach shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- I. this fee exemption applies only to Roach, and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
- II. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
- III. by accepting this exemption, Roach agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- IV. Roach is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via internet-based databases;

- V. this exemption is valid until April 15, 2026 and shall be enforced for any research conducted beginning February 18, 2026.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
