MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a pro se litigant, has filed a complaint alleging misconduct by the three subject United States Circuit Judges.

Complainant alleges that by affirming the district court's dismissal of his claims and denying his appellate motions, the judges:


- “failed to take appropriate action against fraudulent testimony presented during lower court proceedings and upheld decisions tainted by such misconduct”;
- “did not adequately address evidence of secret judicial proceedings that excluded [me] and [my] counsel, thereby failing to uphold due process”;
- “despite clear evidence of inconsistencies and false narratives in court documentation, did not act to correct these records or ensure accountability”;
- erroneously and “improperly denied motions, including those addressing conflicts of interest and perjury by attorneys, as moot”;
- and,
- “failed to uphold their duty to ensure fair and impartial judicial proceedings.”

Complainant concludes that the judges thereby failed to protect his Fifth Amendment and Fourteenth Amendment rights and “fail[ed] to uphold [the] Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.”

The complaint relates directly to the merits of decisions or procedural rulings and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
