
ORDER AND MEMORANDUM OF REASONS

Complainant, a pro se litigant, has filed a complaint alleging misconduct by a United States District Judge in a civil proceeding.

Complainant alleges that the judge “received fellatio by the attorney hired by [the defendant, Complainant’s mother],” and in return, the judge did not instruct the district court clerk to issue a summons to be served on the defendant by the United States Marshals Service. Complainant provides no further information in support of the claim and there is no record of the defendant’s being represented by counsel.

The complaint is “so lacking in indicia of reliability that no further inquiry is warranted” and it is therefore subject to dismissal as frivolous under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). *See* Commentary on Rule 11 of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings, Guide to Judiciary Policy, Vol. 2E, Ch. 3, at 25.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
