PER CURIAM:*

The attorney appointed to represent Beneth Casas-Amador has moved for leave to withdraw and has filed a brief in accordance with *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738 (1967), and *United States v. Flores*, 632 F.3d 229 (5th Cir. 2011). Casas-Amador has filed a response. The record is not sufficiently developed to allow us to make a fair evaluation of Casas-Amador’s claims of ineffective assistance of counsel; we therefore decline to consider the claims

without prejudice to collateral review. *See United States v. Isgar*, 739 F.3d 829, 841 (5th Cir. 2014).

We have reviewed counsel's brief and the relevant portions of the record reflected therein, as well as Casas-Amador's response. We concur with counsel's assessment that the appeal presents no nonfrivolous issue for appellate review. Accordingly, Casas-Amador's motion for the appointment of new counsel is DENIED, the motion for leave to withdraw is GRANTED, counsel is excused from further responsibilities herein, and the APPEAL IS DISMISSED. *See* 5TH CIR. R. 42.2.
