The Federal Public Defender appointed to represent Lorenzo Ruiz-Camacho has moved for leave to withdraw and has filed a brief in accordance with *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738 (1967), and *United States v. Flores*, 632 F.3d 229 (5th Cir. 2011). Ruiz-Camacho has not filed a response. We

have reviewed counsel's brief and the relevant portions of the record reflected therein. It is dispositive that the Government has declined to waive the untimeliness of Ruiz-Camacho's appeal. *See United States v. Pesina-Rodriguez*, 825 F.3d 787, 788 (5th Cir. 2016). Thus, we concur with counsel's assessment that the appeal presents no nonfrivolous issue for appellate review. Accordingly, counsel's motion for leave to withdraw is GRANTED, counsel is excused from further responsibilities herein, and the APPEAL IS DISMISSED. *See* 5TH CIR. R. 42.2.
