PER CURIAM:*

The Federal Public Defender appointed to represent Pedro Israel Rios-Salazar has moved for leave to withdraw and has filed a brief in accordance with *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738 (1967), and *United States v. Flores*, 632 F.3d 229 (5th Cir. 2011). Rios-Salazar has filed a response. We have reviewed counsel's brief and the relevant portions of the record

reflected therein, as well as Rios-Salazar's response. We concur with counsel's assessment that the appeal presents no nonfrivolous issue for appellate review. Accordingly, counsel's motion for leave to withdraw is GRANTED, counsel is excused from further responsibilities herein, and the appeal is DISMISSED. *See* 5TH CIR. R. 42.2. Rios-Salazar's motion for the appointment of new counsel is DENIED as untimely. *See United States v. Wagner*, 158 F.3d 901, 902-03 (5th Cir. 1998).
