PER CURIAM:*

Jaime Aguilar-Guerrero challenges the substantive reasonableness of his 72-month, above-guidelines prison sentence for illegal reentry. Contrary to Guerrero's arguments, the record does not show that the sentence imposed by the district court fails to account for a factor that should have received significant weight, gives significant weight to an irrelevant or improper factor, or represents a clear error of judgment in balancing the

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sentencing factors. *See United States v. Diehl*, 775 F.3d 714, 724 (5th Cir. 2015); *see also United States v. Navarro-Jusino*, 993 F.3d 360, 362-63 & n.3 (5th Cir. 2021).
